The amount raised by the levy in the first calendar year is estimated at \$5,702,887.</p> <p>In Kent County there are local authorities that capture and use, for authorized purposes, tax increment revenues from property taxes levied by the County. Such capture would include a portion of the millage levy. The total amount of captured tax increment revenue from such millage in the first calendar year of the levy is an estimated \$243,962. The maximum number of years the bonds of any series may be outstanding, exclusive of any refunding, is fifteen (15) years.
